Transferring from Community College to a 4-year university

Save Money

Starting at a community college is one of the best ways a student can mitigate the expense of a bachelor's degree. With the average cost of a four-year university surpassing \$35,000, this strategy can save you tens of thousands of dollars. Find Your Passion

One of the most common concerns among students entering college is that they aren't absolutely certain about which degree to pursue. In fact, more than 80% of students end up changing their major at some point during their college career. Get into a better 4-year college

1. MnCAP

When you enroll in the Minnesota Cooperative Admissions Program, you will be guaranteed transfer admission to the University of Minnesota.

- 2. Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathways
 These programs provide a direct
 path to degree completion for
 community college students who
 plan to transfer to an Ohio public
 university to complete their
 bachelor's degree.
- 3. Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG)

 This program guarantees admission to some of the most competitive colleges in the University of California system, which includes UCLA and UC Berkeley.
